MATRIMONY

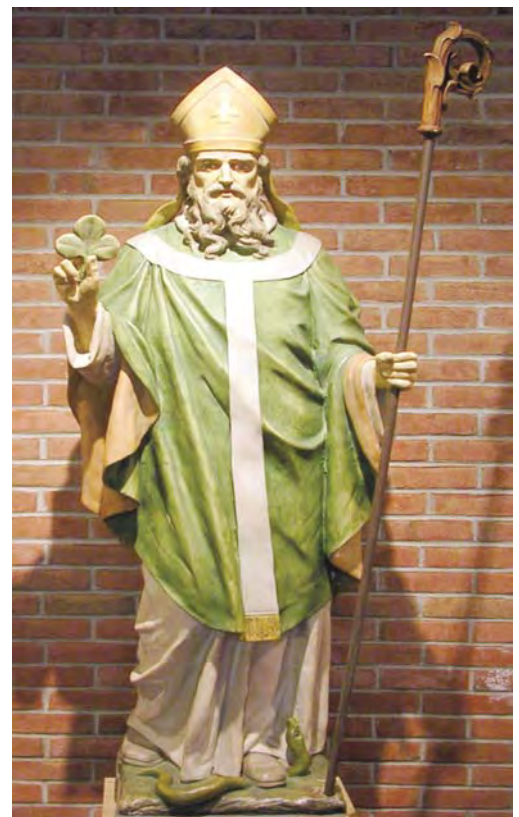
